Government Of Canada Introduces Further Restrictions On International Travel:

The Government of Canada continues to take unprecedented action to protect the health and safety of Canadians by introducing measures to prevent further introduction and transmission of COVID-19 and new variants of the virus into Canada. Today, the Government of Canada announced new rules on international travel, in addition to the multi-layered approach on COVID-19 already in place.



Canada's Airlines Agree to Suspend Sun Destination Flights Until 30APR, New Travel Measures Announced:

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau announced Friday that the country's airlines are suspending all flights to sun destinations as of Sunday until 30APR as a measure to control the spread of COVID-19. "We appreciate the work the Canadian airlines and their frontline workers have done to make air travel safe and bring

Canadians home when this pandemic struck last spring," said Trudeau. "We all agree. Now is just not the time to be flying."



Boeing 737 MAX cleared to fly in Europe:

The European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) has approved the return to service of a modified version of the Boeing 737 MAX. The plane has been approved to fly subject to a package of software upgrades, electrical working rework, maintenance checks, operations manual updates and crew training.



Canada Inks Deal To Produce Millions Of COVID-19 Shots Domestically:

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau announced today a plan to produce millions of COVID-19 shots at a plant in Montreal starting this summer, securing a domestic supply of vaccines as the global market contends with delivery delays and protectionist measures. The National Research Council-owned Royalmount facility will churn out tens of millions

of doses of the product developed by Maryland-based Novavax, Trudeau said.

Use ArriveCAN to provide mandatory travel information on and after your entry into Canada. This link can also be found on your Maritime Travel itinerary/receipt – Apollo Client Statement. Air travellers need to provide proof of a negative molecular COVID-19 test result (PCR or RT-LAMP). This is the case for all travellers 5 years of age and older.
