Travel Bubble Coming To Atlantic Canada July 3: An Atlantic Canada travel bubble has been confirmed and will begin July 3. Interprovincial travel will be allowed to happen between Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland and Labrador without self-isolation.



Canada Extends Ban On Most Foreign Travellers To At Least July 31:

Ottawa has extended for at least another month a sweeping travel ban that bars entry to all travellers who are not Canadian citizens, permanent residents or people entering from the U.S. for "essential" reasons.



Canadians To Be Allowed Into EU Countries, But U.S. Citizens Shut Out:

The European Union announced Tuesday that it will reopen its borders to travellers from 14 countries, but most Americans have been refused entry for at least another two weeks due to soaring coronavirus infections in the U.S.
